Definition of Final Ratings on Evaluation Forms

- **FAIR (WHITE)**: If a youth presenter receives a “Fair Rating” then this means that his/her presentation generally needs improvement. In other words, for his/her age and experience level, the Presenter did not meet expectations and should spend more time practicing his/her presentation. Be sure to consider each of the individual rating factors (and their definitions) on the Evaluation Form when rehearsing.
- **GOOD (RED)**: If a youth presenter receives a “Good Rating” then this means that his/her presentation generally **met expectations** and/or was **above expectations**. In other words, the presenter met all of the basic expectations for his/her age and experience level and may have exceeded expectations in certain areas. If the presenter is selected to advance to District (Regional) Presentations, then he/she should continue to rehearse in the meantime; paying particular attention to the rating factors which may have received a low score, in an effort to improve those skills. Be sure to keep time limits in mind.
- **EXCELLENT (BLUE)**: If a youth presenter receives an “Excellent Rating” then this means that his/her presentation was generally **outstanding**. In other words, the presenter **exceeded expectations** for his/her age and experience level. If the presenter is selected to advance to District or State Presentations, then he/she should continue to rehearse in the meantime; paying particular attention to any rating factors which may have received a low score, in an effort to improve those skills. Be sure to keep time limits in mind.
